

<p>Runner</p>	<p>Duties: Volunteers run errands for the shelter: Purchase supplies and pick up donations. Volunteers must record locations visited on a shared spreadsheet</p> <p>Qualifications: Must meet with the volunteer coordinator about this opportunity. Must be at least 18 years old and have a valid driver’s license. You would need to provide your own reliable personal vehicle and be capable of doing heavy lifting</p> <p>Times Needed: One day per week</p>
<p>Condo/Kennel Cleaning</p>	<p>Duties: Clean and sanitize shelter housing areas for animals. Feed animals and provide clean water. Be aware of behavioral and medical needs</p> <p>Training: In order to work around the animals, training is mandatory and often happens as you work alongside another volunteer.</p> <p>Times Needed: Daily, 8:00 am – 10:00 am</p>
<p>Feline Friends</p>	<p>Duties: Provide humane companionship, interactive playtime and socialization to help the cats cope with shelter life. Clean up after the cats and help staff care for them as needed. Requires handling soiled items</p> <p>Qualifications: Must be able to interact with the cats. Basic understanding of cat behavior and cat handling skills</p> <p>Training: In order to work with the animals, training is mandatory and often happens as you work alongside another volunteer</p> <p>Times Needed: Daily</p>
<p>Dog Enrichment</p>	<p>Duties: For the dogs, each day includes walks in all kinds of weather and special enrichment activity. Train (basic commands) and socialize the dogs. Clean up after the dogs and help staff care for them as needed. Requires handling of soiled items</p> <p>Qualifications: Must be able to interact with dogs of various sizes, shapes, breeds, and training levels. Prior understanding and dog handling skills are preferred, but not necessary.</p> <p>Training: Dog enrichment program training is mandatory (2 hours). Followed by buddy walks</p> <p>Times Needed: Times needed are flexible but we ask for a 2 hour weekly commitment between the hours of 9 am – 5 pm.</p>

<p>Shelter Assistant</p>	<p>Duties: Typical duties include: general cleaning, customer service, basic animal care, help maintain animal play yards. Requires handling of soiled items</p> <p>Qualifications: Must be able to work with the public</p> <p>Training: In order to work with the animals, training is mandatory and often happens as you work alongside another volunteer</p> <p>Times Needed: Daily</p>
<p>Routine Maintenance</p>	<p>Duties: Doing various outside and/or inside work for SCHS. Outside: groundskeeping, gardening, hauling cans to recycling, etc. Inside: plumbing, painting, heavy work, etc</p> <p>Qualifications: Some specialized skills will be required for certain tasks.</p> <p>Times Needed: When needs arise</p>
<p>Animal Transport</p>	<p>Duties: Transport animals to and from vet appointments. Animals typically need to be dropped off at the vet by 8 am and they get picked up by 4 pm.</p> <p>Qualifications: Must be at least 18 years old, have a valid driver's license and a reliable personal vehicle</p> <p>Times Needed: On call, weekdays</p>
<p>Adoption Support</p>	<p>Duties: Assist staff members during adoption hours: greet families, bring the animals to the families, pack up the adoption bags and anything else staff members need. When there is down time you can help with photography, laundry, clean, fill water bowls, socialize with the animals, etc.</p> <p>Qualifications: Must be able to work with the public</p> <p>Training: In order to work with animals, training is mandatory and often happens as you work alongside another volunteer</p> <p>Times Needed: During adoption day events</p>
<p>Event Staffing</p>	<p>Duties: Support a variety of events in the community. Some of these events include: Fair Booth, Merry Market, Pancake Dinners, Home and Rec Show, and Downtown Thursdays. Volunteer would also be needed to help set up/tear down.</p>

	<p>Qualifications: Must be friendly, outgoing and knowledgeable about the shelter</p> <p>Times Needed: Generally, event shifts are 2-4 hours long.</p>
Fostering	<p>Duties: Sometimes animals with special needs are placed in foster homes where they can receive more appropriate care than in the shelter. This could include animals with medical or behavioral issues, or pregnant or nursing mothers. This may also include bottle feeding kittens. Other times, animals simply need a break from the shelter setting and can use the extra attention from a foster caregiver.</p> <p>Qualifications: Must have an approved foster home application. Most criteria will depend on the individual foster care need.</p> <p>Times Needed: Short term care (1-7 days) to Long-term care (up to 3 months).</p> <p>Directions to Volunteer: Please complete a foster home application found on our Become a Foster page. We will send out messages about foster care needs. Please respond to a message if you can help.</p>
